

Georgia's Business Enterprise Program (BEP) provides work opportunities to persons who are legally visually impaired or blind as certified by an ophthalmologist or optometrist pursuant to the federal Randolph-Sheppard Act of 1936.

The BEP, one of six divisions in the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency (GVRA), was authorized by the federal Randolph-Sheppard Act of 1936 and was established in Georgia in 1944. It is recognized as the State Licensing Agency (SLA) and has priority for operating businesses on federal property and may also operate sites on other properties. Sites include snack bars, cafes, cafeterias, coffee bars, food courts, gift and sundry shops, military dining facilities, vending routes, interstate rest areas and welcome centers.

If you are an agency or business interested in providing your customers and/or employees with a convenient on-site food, vending or beverage service, the BEP would be happy to discuss our various levels of service based on customer specifications. It will be our responsibility to assist in the design and layout of the service you request, provide all equipment and merchandise inventory, as well as select a licensed blind vendor manager to service your location.

Valdosta Police Department Opens Prescription Drug Drop Off Box

Valdosta Police Department Press Release:

The Valdosta Police Department now has a Consumer Drug Take-Back Program. The department has contracted with a drug disposal company and has placed a Drug Drop-Box in the outer lobby at Valdosta Police Headquarters. This lobby is open 24 hours a day to our citizens.

The type of drugs which can be dropped off include Schedule II-V controlled substances which include all prescription and medicinal-related drugs for human and pet consumption. The box is very similar to a US Postal Mail Box in that you open the top drawer, place medication inside, and close the drawer. There is no fee or documentation requirements for our citizens. Simply drop the prescription drugs in the box; that's it. Once per month, the discarded drugs are disposed of properly by the outside company following federal guidelines for disposal-of Schedule II-V Drugs.

"In light of the issues with opioids and other prescription drugs in our country, this Drug Drop-Off box gives our citizens a way to discard unused prescription drugs safely and to avoid them ending up in the wrong hands", stated Chief Brian Childress.

Service Overview

Emergency Shelter — Provides a safe place for victims of domestic violence to stay with their children. The program has a 22 bed capacity and offers a 4-6 week stay. While in our shelter clothing, food, and transportation are provided.



Case Management — This program assesses the current needs of the clients and will help them set goals to complete while at the shelter. These goals may include job and/or housing searches.

Rapid Rehousing — Working with the landlords and other housing options, clients may qualify for our rapid re-housing program if permanent housing is a goal. In this program clients will receive temporary assistance for obtaining housing. Follow-ups will be conducted for up to six months after leaving the shelter to ensure the client is able to maintain housing.

Therapy — The Haven provides all of our clients with counselling services. Our therapist works with domestic violence, sexual assault for residential and outreach clients to provide them with discussions on emotions and experiences to help improve their overall mental health.

Children's Program — Works with the children in the shelter by offering them support groups, taking them on field trips, and doing arts and crafts. Our children's advocate helps the children get enrolled in school and teaches parenting classes. Parenting classes and other supports are also offered to the mother's.

Outreach — Works with victims in the community to ensure they are safe and offers them the same services victims in the shelter would receive. The outreach advocate can act as a link between child protective services and the victim by coordinating case plans. They also offer domestic violence assessments.

Legal — Provide victims of domestic violence and sexual assault with guidance through the legal system. Our legal advocate can assist with getting Temporary Protective Orders (TPO) and accompany victims to court. The legal advocate acts as a liaison between the judges and law enforcement to serve the needs of the victim.

Rape Crisis Center — Our sexual assault center is one of three free-standing centers in Georgia. We provide victims of sexual assault with on site forensic exams conducted by a sexual assault nurse examiner (S.A.N.E.).

Prevention Education — The purpose of prevention education is to promote healthy relationships and risk awareness with the hope of preventing dating violence and sexual assault to adolescents and young adults.

Volunteer — Seeks dedicated individuals with a passion for volunteer work and a commitment to The Haven and its mission. This program is to allow the community to contribute to our cause through direct and indirect volunteering.
